Key Ideas

- 1. The power of our words (1-5)
 - We will give account for eery careless word we speak (Matt 12:46)
 - Nothing plays a grater roles in determining the course of our life than our speech
 - We are in a 'battle for vocal holiness' (Sinclair Ferguson)
- 2. The danger of our words (5-8)
 - The effect of sinful speech can be destructive in ways that can be far more devastating that we can foresee.
 - Note the strong language that James uses to describe sinful speech
 - We can never say that the Holy Spririt leads us to speech that tears others down.
 - Gossip is the report of information or facts about someone who isn't present, usually to the detriment of others view of that person.
 - Slander is speech against someone that has the effect or intent of tearing another person down.
 - Three questions we should ask about our speech before we talk:
 - Why am I telling this person these things?
 - Would I talk any differently if the person were here?
 - Is my manner and motive for this conversation pleasing to God?
 - The right to free speech doesn't exempt us from the call to godly speech
 - Normal human means apart from the power of God will not tame the tongue for long



- 3. The transformation of our words (9-12)
 - Untimately our speech is important because it represents God
 - The goal of all speech is to bless God and bless others
 - An evidence of true relationship with God through Christ will be that over time our speech will more and more reflect his glory.

- 5. What are some ways you as a group can grow together in godly speech or putting off sinful speech?
